



Older Age Groups (10-12) - (13-15)

Two Truths and One Lie - Have the kids sit in a circle and say two true things about themselves and one lie. The other kids can guess which are true and which are false.

THIS GAME CAN WORK FOR 13-15 AS WELL, BUT IS BETTER FOR 10-12

Invitation to Dinner - Have the kids sit in a circle and say three people, dead or alive, that they would invite to dinner and why.

Charades - Have the kids write down a topic or two (depending on the # of kids) on a slip or two of paper and place them in a hat. Have the kids take turns going up and acting out their topic that they pull from the hat. Once another kid guesses the topic, they will go, and this will continue until there are no more topics left. **Optional:** Time the kid acting out their topic for however long you wish (We recommend 30 seconds) and choose another person to go if they do not make their time.

What's The Question? - Have the kids split up into two groups, one will decide a question to ask and the other will choose a representative. Once the question is chosen and the representative is ready, one person from the group that chose the question will whisper the question into the other team's representative's ear. This must be done very quietly.

Ex. "What is the color of the sky?"

The representative must give an answer out loud, but can not give an answer that only has one word.

Ex. "The color of the object is blue."

The example given is a perfect response. It gives a clue that the question has an object, but does not give an answer that would reveal the question. The people from the team that has to solve the question will try to guess the question, and the person who gets it right will join the other team. This may continue until all

Note: This game is a more difficult one that would be hard to solve or come up with a question. Pre-made questions are a good idea.
